## SS Double Play Pivot Drill

For this drill we will simulate a 4-6-3 double play.

The #1 job of the SS when a ball is hit to the  $2^{nd}$  baseman with a man on  $1^{st}$  base is to get to the bag as quickly as possible.

Instead of putting you left foot on the bag as the 2<sup>nd</sup> baseman does...the SS will put his right foot to the bag and anticipates a bad throw and when the ball comes....you take your left foot to the ball which then puts you in a good line to throw to 1<sup>st</sup> base.

Remember: Get to the bag early...Right foot to the bag...Left foot to the ball.

For this drill...I like to roll ground balls to the 2<sup>nd</sup> baseman close enough to the bag so the 2<sup>nd</sup> baseman can practice their under hand flip to the SS....the SS is to get to the bag early...Right foot to the bag.... Get in an athletic stand....feet spread slightly...hands up to show a nice big target....receive the ball...get in a good line to throw to 1<sup>st</sup> base....finish the drill by having the SS throw to 1<sup>st</sup> base.

I usually have the kids follow their throws to the next station. This way every kid gets time at each position.


1st Base

For drill purposes have the SS a little closer to the bag than normal playing depth.
